Preserve Description

The Hill and Dale Preserve lies within New Jersey Conservation Foundation's **Black River Greenway** project area which includes parts of Hunterdon, Morris and Somerset counties.

This 180-square mile area is named after the Black River (also known as the Lamington River), a tributary of the North Branch of the Raritan River. Holding some of the largest open spaces in the stretch between Manhattan and Philadelphia, the Black River Greenway faces tremendous development pressure.

New Jersey Conservation Foundation and local land conservation groups, municipalities and counties are partnering to identify and protect lands that are vital to our future.

Preserve Rules

- No motorized vehicles of any kind except in designated parking areas.
- No damage, removal, or disturbance to any plant, animal, or physical feature of any kind.
- No fires or overnight camping.
- No swimming.
- No ice-skating.
- No hunting without written permission. No possession of firearms.
- No public use of any kind after dark.
